BRIKSDAL GLACIER HIKE & JOSTELDALSBREEN NATIONAL PARK - HEL05

Photography and nature enthusiasts will look forward to this full-day excursion. Waterfalls, lakes, glaciers and plenty of unspoilt nature, this hike has everything that Norway is so proud and famous for. Leave the small village of Hellesylt and enjoy an approx. 2-hour scenic drive through the Geirangerfjord District, to Briksdal Glacier, a massive glacier that flows down a mountainside into the Briksdal Valley. Be sure to keep your camera ready, as there are photo opportunities at every turn. En route, you'll pass the Hellesylt Waterfall and marvel at its water cascading down polished granite stones. The sparkling Hornindalsvannet, Europe's deepest lake, is also a sight to behold before continuing along the Nordfjord to Olden and ascending the valley dotted with farms, waterfalls, and ice fields. After arrival at Briksdalen Inn, the tour continues on foot: the track crosses the river and climbs in zigzag above the fall to the top where you will enjoy the fantastic view of this arm of the Jostedals Glacier. The walk to the foot of the glacier takes 45 minutes minutes, with the first part somewhat steep, and thereafter comparatively flat till you reach the actual glacier. As you reach the Briksdal Glacier, it is necessary to respect the warning signs put up near the glacier for the sake of your security. After the visit to the glacier, you walk back the same path to the Briksdal Inn where a well-deserved rest and a delicious lunch break await you. After lunch, board the coach again for a scenic drive via Stryn, Loen and Olden on the way to your ship.

Please note: this excursion is unsuitable for guests with walking difficulties. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. Lunch does not include drinks, which are at the guests' expenses. This tour is available when the ship calls in Hellesylt only.

SCENIC ROUTE

DRAMATIC NORANG VALLEY - HEL06



Experience the beautiful Norang Valley with its steep, majestic mountains on this scenic tour. Your scenic drive begins with a stop at the Hellesylt Waterfall, a short distance from the pier. Have a brief pause to capture photos of this impressive waterfall, before continuing through the wild and rugged Nordang Valley. As your guide enlightens you with information on the area, soak up the stunning landscape, complete with steep, imposing mountains, small lakes, and picturesque summer farms. Enjoy a brief stop at Øye, a small village at the head of Hjørundfjord, amongst the Sunnmøre Alps, and home to the Union Øye Hotel, which was established back in 1891. During the journey back towards the Norang Valley, a photo stop will be made at Lake Lyngstøylvatnet, the result of a rockslide in 1908 which caused the river to take a new course, hence the creation of the lake. Beneath the waters of the lake it is possible to see vegetation and remains of the old road, the gateway, and the farmhouses. As you continue through the valley, enjoy a photo stop at Ura Summer Farm, before passing through Hellesylt and making a final stop at Ljøen, a viewpoint offering a wonderful panoramic view of the UNESCO World Heritage Natural Site: Geirangerfjord.

Please note: This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion. This tour is available when the ship calls in Hellesylt only.

STRANDAFJELL CABLE CAR - HEL07

Duration 3:30 h



Your half-day tour made of amazing views and some time to taste Norwegian hospitality begins at Hellesylt, a small but important village at the head of the Synnulvsfjord, a branch of the mighty Storfjord. Board the coach and see the beautiful Hellesylt waterfall before ascending the valley to arrive at Ljøen viewpoint. If weather conditions are good, you will have fantastic views of the fjord below and part of the famous World heritage Listed Geirangerfjord. The tour continues with a drive to the village of Stranda beautifully situated at the banks of the mighty Storfjord. Enjoy some time on your own to take a stroll in the charming village centre. Next, a coach transfer will take you to the base station of Mount Strandafjellet lifts. Stranda is a well-known ski resort: get into one of the 20 gondolas each taking up to 8 persons and soon you are whisked to the top of Mount Roalden at 1042 metres above sea level. Weather permitting, the panoramic views are spectacular with mountains and fjords. And to add a special touch to your Norwegian experience, take advantage of their hospitality in the restaurant with a snack made of waffle served with coffee or tea. After going down to the base station, you will return to Hellesylt via the same road.

Please note: this excursion is unsuitable for guests suffering from vertigo or acrophobia. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. Visibility from scenic outlooks depend on weather conditions the day of call. The Stranda may close at very short notice for safety reasons. This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion. This tour is available when the ship calls in Hellesylt only.

STRYN AND LOEN SKYLIFT - HEL08

Duration 6:30 h



Hellesylt is a small but important village at the head of the Synnulvsfjord, a branch of the mighty Storfjord, and the starting point of this half-day tour. The scenic drive will allow you to almost immediately see the beautiful Hellesylt waterfall on the way up to Europe's deepest lake, Hornindalsvannet, with tranquil and crystal-clear water 514 metres deep. Passing through the village of Stryn, you will reach the lovely Stryn lake, known for its delightful turquoise colour. Your destination is at Oppstryn and the Jostedal Glacier National Park Centre to admire the interesting exhibits beneath and on the glacier. The centre's garden contains botanical specimens of wild fauna and medicinal herbs from this harsh environment as well as a unique collection of stones. After the visit, the tour continues to the Skylift in Loen to ride on the brand-new cable car taking you up to mount Hoven 1011 metres above the sea - around 200 metres above the tree line in this part of Norway. Enjoy the spectacular views of the fjord and villages below as well as the surrounding mountain scenery. During your stay at Hoven, you have the possibility to enjoy a short walk to soak up the scenery around and have a break at the restaurant for a delicious lunch. The return to Hellesylt is via the same road with a photo stop to admire the old stone bridge built in 1792.

Please note: this excursion is unsuitable for guests suffering from vertigo or acrophobia. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. Lunch does not include drinks, which are at the guests' expenses. Visibility from scenic outlooks depend on weather conditions the day of call. The Loen Skylift may close at very short notice for safety reasons. This tour is available when the ship calls in Hellesylt only.

As you get further from land, the speed will increase, and your high-speed adventure will start as you chase the waves. An experience not to miss!

The captain of the boat will offer a guided commentary during the tour in English or German only. Guests must be at least 12 years of age to take part. SCENIC ROUTE

SCENIC CRUISE TO GEIRANGERFJORD - HEL11

Duration 0 2:30 h

On the scenic cruise from Hellesylt, you will discover the scenery of Geirangerfjord and understand why this part of Norway has attracted travelers for over a century. The fjord is like a blue ribbon carved into a mountainous landscape, providing visitors with access to a remote corner of Norway. Geirangerfjord has been added to the UNESCO's World Heritage List due to the breathtaking scenery and has been described as "the world's most beautiful fjord". Take this opportunity to get closer to the fjord by leisurely gliding through the dramatic landscape and feel the presence of the towering mountains surrounding you. As you cruise through Geirangerfjord a guide will tell stories about the people who defied the up to 1500-metre tall mountains to make a living on the steep mountainsides and the small farmsteads clinging to rocky ledges. The tour will pass at the Seven Sisters Waterfall where water pummels from a 300m steep cliffside down to the fjord below before returning you safely back to the pier.

Please note: This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion. The tour is conducted with different types of boats depending on availability on the day of the call. Therefore, not all boats may be wheelchair accessible. Guests are advised to contact the Shore Excursions' Desk once on board to check whether the boat used on the day of their excursion is wheelchair accessible. If it is not and guests in wheelchairs have booked the tour before the cruise, they will be reimbursed on board. This tour is available when the ship calls in Hellesylt only.

BUD & ERGAN FORT - MLD07

The charming town of Molde lies sheltered from northerly winds on the northern slopes of the wide Romsdalsfjord and is consequently blessed with lush vegetation. This tour starts with a drive through the beautiful scenery past Elnesvågen to Bud, a charming fishing village facing the open ocean. You'll stop here to take a closer look at the Ergan Fort. Dating from the Second World War, today it is a restored war memorial museum. Heading underground there is a network of bunkers, headquarters, and soldiers' quarters to explore, containing weapons and other equipment. Returning above ground, there is a fine view to enjoy across to the Bjørnsund islands, where in the past there was a thriving fishing community. Today the buildings are used as summer holiday homes. Your tour concludes with the return drive to Molde

Please note: limited number of guides in languages other than English. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only. As this tour involves narrow passages and approx. 20 steps to descend/climb, it is unsuitable for guests who are claustrophobic. This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion.

CITY TOUR

MOLDE CITY TOUR & THE ATLANTIC ROAD - MLD08

Molde, also known as the "Town of Roses", enjoys a comparatively mild climate despite its northern location due to the warm Atlantic gulf stream and the town's sheltered mountain location. The town has actually been rebuilt twice, first after a fire in 1916 and again after suffering heavy bombing during World War II. Your enjoyable sightseeing tour includes a visit to the open-air folk museum: Romsdal Museum, one of the largest provincial museums in Norway and comprises well over 40 buildings, illustrating developments from the Viking Age right up to the end of the 19th century. Your excursion also takes you across the hills down to the Frænfjord and on to Bud, a charming fishing village facing the open ocean. Here you will have a photo stop at the site of the fortifications from the World War II before continuing along Hustadvika, an ill-reputed stretch of sea dotted with underwater reefs and rocky islands. You will then reach the impressive Atlantic Ocean road, known as one of the most beautiful journeys in the world and voted as Norway's construction of the century. On our way back we follow the Kornstadfjord on the inside, via Eide and then overland back to the pier in Molde.

Please note: limited number of guides in languages other than English. Should a tour guide for your language be unavailable, the tour will be in English only. This tour includes walking over uneven surfaces with steps and thresholds at Romsdal Museum; guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part.

MOLDE CITY WALK & THE ROYAL BIRCH - MLD10



Protected against northerly and westerly winds, Molde lies at the foot of the hills, facing a fjord, which opens on to a magnificent panorama of 87 snow-capped mountain peaks. Molde is called the "Town of Roses" because numerous plants, which really belong to far warmer climates, grow here on sunny slopes. From mid-June onwards and throughout August, Molde abounds in fragrant, blooming roses. Along the main street Storgata there is a beautiful avenue of Paul's Scarlet Hawthorns, and several roses have been planted by the shops. At the Town Hall Square in the "Town of Roses" stands the bronze statue "Rosepiken", surrounded by a dancing fountain, a sculpture of a young and beautiful Rose Maiden with her arms full of roses. From the street Olsmedbakken and towards the Moldegård villa, many of the old wooden houses have been restored and decorated with roses. You will continue to the Royal Birch, the place where King Haakon and Crown Prince Olav sought shelter from German bombers in April 1940 when they were being hunted by the German occupying forces. The Peace Grove next to the Royal Birch symbolizes the continuing struggle for freedom, peace, and human dignity both today and in the future.

SCENIC ROUTE

AMAZING NATURE VIEWS ON THE FAMOUS FLAM RAILWAY - FLA04





Once you are ready for the steep roads and mountain tunnels of this region, you can sit back and enjoy the ride through spectacular countryside. Leaving the port of Flam, we will traverse a long tunnel that takes us to Gudvangen, and the coach will climb through the steep, narrow Naeroy valley. We will stop at the Tvindefossen waterfalls, a twin cascade of two fabulous falls. The excursion continues to the town of Voss, prettily located on the Vangvatnet Lake. We will board a train to continue our outing across a range of stunning natural landscapes, before reaching Myrdal. Here, at 867 metres above sea level, we will change trains and continue down the breathtaking Flam valley, travelling on the world famous Flam Line. The train will pass by Kjosfossen waterfall to allow passengers enjoy the lovely view before terminating at Flam station, on the Sognefjord, from where we can walk back to the ship. Lunch included.

Please note: the excursion includes a long train ride through a series of tunnel. The order of the visits may change. Some groups will start the tour by train and end the tour by coach and vice versa. Consequently, the arrival at the restaurant might include an early or a late lunch, depending on the day of each call. This tour is unsuitable for guests who are claustrophobic or have walking difficulties. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion.

NATURAL WONDERS

NAEROYFJORD PLEASURE CRUISE & WATERFALLS - FLA06





The tour starts with a short walk from your ship to the pier located just in front of the railway station. Here you will board the sightseeing boat for a 2-hour pleasure cruise on the Aurlandsfjord and the Naeroyfjord. The cruise covers some of the most beautiful parts of the Sognefjord; we sail past steep, snow-clad mountains, rushing waterfalls and a living cultural landscape before disembarking in Gudvangen. The excursion continues by bus through the narrow and impressive Naeroydalen Valley with more impressive cascades, before arriving at the warm and welcoming Stalheim Hotel, some 1.237 feet above sea level, for coffee. The last part of the tour takes us back through a long valley tunnel, through more mountain sceneries before arriving back at the pier in Flam.

Please note: this tour is unsuitable for guests who are claustrophobic as it includes driving through 2 long tunnels: Gudvanga Tunnel (11.4 km) and Flenja Tunnel (5.5 km). The order of the visits may change. Some groups will start the tour by boat and end the tour by coach and vice versa. Guests with any type of food intolerance are required to communicate it to the Shore Excursions Office at least two days before the call. This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion. Coffee break may take place either at Stalheim Hotel or at Gudvangen Fjordtell Hotel. Those who have their coffee break in Gudvangen will still go to Stalheim for a scenic stop.

SCENIC ROUTE

FJORDIC VIEWS BY BOAT & COACH - FLA14

Take yourself off the ship for two hours to feast your eyes on Norway's stunning landscape on this boat- and coach-based tour. You'll board a brand-new hybrid vessel - the Vision of the Fjords - in Flam to then glide through the narrow Naerøyfjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Keep your camera at hand to capture the breathtaking scenery, with steep mountains to either side that rise to around 1.800 m above mean sea level. Replete with gushing waterfalls and picturesque villages, this area is one of the loveliest fjordic landscapes on earth. The relaxing 2-hour cruise ends in Gudvangen, where you'll board a coach for the return journey to Flam and your ship.

Please note: Visibility from scenic outlooks depend on weather conditions the day of call. This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion.

Wheelchair and disabled-friendly tour - Wheelchair guests must be accompanied by their own helper to get on/off the coach. PROTECTOURS: FLAM VALLEY WALK - FLA18





Every imaginable shade of green, the bracing Norwegian air and superb fjordic views await you on this walk through the lovely Flam Valley on the shores of Aurlandsfjorden. Your walk will take you down a road that bisects the valley and was built to facilitate the construction of the main Oslo-Bergen railway line in 1924. With lushly vegetated mountainsides soaring upwards to either side, you'll stroll along the River Flam to pass several farms and spot the marvellous tiered cascades of the Rjoandefossen waterfall from a distance. An external view of the 17th-century Flam Church, situated outside of town, is your last stop, after which you'll return to the ship via the same route.

Please note: Guides available in English only. Subject to availability, it may be possible to provide support in other languages. Guests need to be at least 15 years old to take part. Guests of limited mobility are requested to evaluate their personal level of stamina and ability before taking part. This tour may have multiple departures throughout the ship's time in port. You will receive all information about your specific departure the day before the excursion.

SCENIC ROUTE

SCENIC FLÅM RAILWAY - FLA20





Take a trip on one of the most interesting railways in the world and be rewarded with some of the most stunning scenery in Norway. The Flåm Railway is a remarkable piece of engineering which provides wonderful vistas of the mountains and waterfalls that characterise this beautiful part of Norway. Boarding the train at Flåm Station, you'll travel along the Flåm River, which is one of the best salmon rivers in the west country, to Myrdal Station at an altitude of 2.845 feet (861 m) above sea level. Admire the fabulous scenery passing by along the 12.5 miles (21 km) track, including the sheer drop of the Rjoande Waterfall and the impressive peak of Vibmesnosi Mountain. In order to climb the 985 feet (300 m) Myrdalsberg, the rairoad is built on 4 levels. As your train stands on the 4th level, you can see all of the stop at Kjosfossen Waterfall to photograph the spectacular 305-feet (93 m) cascading waterfall. At Myrdal, the train turns around and returns to Flåm.

Please note: the walk to Flåm station takes 5 minutes. There are a few steep steps to embark the train and the journey is approximately 60 minutes each way. There is a limited taped commentary on the train. This tour involves several tunnels, it is unsuitable for guests suffering from claustrophobia. The train stops at Myrdal for 5-10 minutes to turnaround; as soon as it is ready it will depart therefore passengers are requested to remain on the train.

Wheelchair and disabled-friendly tour - Wheelchair guests must be accompanied by their own helper to get on/off the coach. PANORAMIC KIEL AND SURROUNDINGS - KIE20T



This panoramic tour will give you an excellent overview of Kiel, your port of call, as well as the surrounding countryside. Kiel enjoys an international reputation as the venue of several important sailing events, including the annual Kiel Week – the world's biggest sailing competition. In fact, the first-class conditions at sea and meticulous organisation on land have lent Kiel the title of "the world's unofficial sailing competitions in 1936 and 1972. One of these was held in the Kiel suburb of Schilksee, which is naturally on the itinerary. The many little sailing boats and the unique architecture of Schilksee are a living testament to the colourful event. The tour of the city will also take you to see the famous early 20th-century town hall, the majestic Kiel Fjord, an inlet of the Baltic Sea, and the impressive Kiel Canal, which both connects the North and Baltic Seas and is the world's busiest artificial waterway. Your return to the pier and your ship marks the end of this scenic excursion.


